If you already have a church let us be your second church. If you are not always able to make it to your home church, come to ours when you cannot make it to yours. Our services vary from week to week, but most often are led by a worship team leading contemporary Christian worship. There are occasions, however, when we worship using the timeless hymns of the faith.

During our worship service we provide a nursery for infants and toddlers. Please ask any of our members for assistance in locating the nursery which is always staffed by persons who love children and are trusted by the church's leadership. We offer the Lord's Supper (Communion) on a weekly basis. This is in keeping with the example of Scripture. All Christians, including guests are invited to partake of the Lord's supper.

Each Sunday, we invite the congregation to share how God has answered a prayer for them or to present things they'd like the church to pray for. Some even have simply asked that we pray for a need they have that they don't wish to make known (a "silent request"). We've been blessed time and time again with miraculous answers from the Lord.

Common Concerns About Attending Church

I am a member of another church, therefore I cannot attend yours.

- We are pleased that you have a church, and encourage you to attend every Sunday. Our church is made up of people from many Christian (and secular) backgrounds. God's word is the same and He wants us to come closer to Him by studying what He has provided.

I attend church on the "important" holidays, isn't that enough?

- God specifically commands us to set aside one day a week as the Sabbath (day of worship). It is both a day of rest for our physical body and for our spirit. God gives us 168 hours per week, don't you think we could give Him 1 hour or two back? In return for that time, He gives us grace, encouragement, strength for the week ahead, and a divine perspective of purpose.

I do not believe in organized religion.

- Our church concentrates on understanding God's word and how to apply it to our daily lives – we are not about the formalities (come as you are – no need to dress up). We believe that we can learn more as a group, through discussions and learning from other perspectives.

I can worship God on my own.

- Yes you can! And we encourage it, however, the Bible says that believers must not keep apart from other believers (Hebrews 10: 24-25). There are three spiritual pillars to have a strong Christian life: personal prayer, Bible study and fellow believers.

Church is boring.

- If you think that the reason for going to church is to fulfill an obligation through some ritual, then yes, it can be tedious, but learning what the very words from God truly mean – that is what church is all about.

I don't know anyone.

- We promise you will before you leave!

If people knew what I have done, they would not want me in their church.

- God already knows everything you have done and is waiting for you to ask for forgiveness, and then it is forgotten in his eyes. If God does that, who are we to do otherwise? There is a saying, "You are not too bad to come in, or too good to stay home from church" – we really believe that.

Common Concerns About Attending Church

Churches are too political these days.

- Every church is made up of people with different opinions, we respect that and therefore concentrate on the only opinion that matters – God’s.

After hearing about the criminal things done in church, I don’t want anything to do with it.

- It is true that there have been some truly evil things done in the name of religion – but please know that this is man’s sinful ways and not God’s way. The vast majority of clergy and parishioners truly follow God’s commands in relation to treatment of others.

I will go to church once things slow down.

- Unfortunately, things almost never slow down. Going to church weekly can reset your outlook and give you strength for the week to come. Church attendance helps you give your worries to God – there is no better feeling than knowing that He is with you every step of the way.

Church goers are hypocrites.

- Churches are full of people who have struggled with various sins in their lives, and all people still struggle with sin. The fact is that we have a fallen nature and we war against it - sometimes without success, which makes our failures all the more visible to the world. Being a Christian does not mean we are perfect. Being a Christian means that we recognize our sins, try and turn from them, and try to act like Christ. Obviously, we fail. We too are far from perfect, but Tri County Christian Church might be the perfect place for you to find authentic spiritual friendships.

I'm a good person and trying my best, and that's what church and being a Christian is all about isn't it?

- Patterning ourselves after Jesus does make us a better person, and that is part of being a Christian. However, it is not what you do, but why you do it. As Paul teaches: “it is by faith in Jesus Christ that we are saved, not through works alone.”
